

Arts & Crafts


- Inspiration from British Arts and Crafts Movement 1880-1920







Henry Chapman Mercer 1856-1930



- 1879 Graduates from Harvard
- 1880 Founding member of Bucks County Historical Society
- 1881 Graduates Penn Law
- 1881-1889 travels in Europe
- 1894 to 1897, Curator of American and Prehistoric Archaeology at The University of Pennsylvania Museum, Philadelphia.
- 1897 Begins collecting, including early German Pottery
- 1898 founded Moravian Pottery and Tile Works
- Publishes several books on early American houses and tools and a collection of supernatural stories.






Alice Belin 1872-1944


- 1890 Graduates from MIT
- 1902 Takes control of Du Pont with cousins Colman and Alfred
- 1906 Buys Pierce estate and renames it Longwood, a name possible going back to a stop on the underground railroad
- 1915 Mother dies and marries first cousin Alice Belin
- 1915 Buys Colman's stock and marginalizes Alfred
- 1919 President of DuPont
- 1920 1923 President of General Motors
- Remained active on DuPont Corp and philanthropy including Delaware Public Schools & MIT


















Henry F. Du Pont 1880 -1969



H. F., Ruth Wales, Pauline Louise & Ruth Ellen DuPont

- Mother Dies in 1902
- Graduates from Harvard in 1903 majoring in horticulture and becomes estate manager
- 1916 Marries Ruth Wales
- 1920's becomes interested in breeding cattle
- 1923 travels to New England and becomes interested in antiques
- 1926 Father dies & HF inherits Winterthur





- \$3,100,000 Expansion and landscaping
- \$3,500,000 Furnishings
- 95,000 square feet
- Over 100 rooms
- 9 stories tall at the tallest wing


Al Ravenna New York World-Telegram and the Sun staff photographer

- 1888-1893 Worked for Adler and Sullivan
- 1901 Wright had completed about 50 projects
- 1909 Robie House and work is published in Europe in 1910
- 1917-1922 Japanese work
- 1923 Los Angles work
- 1932 "The Disappearing City" & the Usonian Houses'

Edgar J. Kaufman



- 1871 Uncles Jacob and Isaac start Kaufmanns department store in Pittsburg
- 1909, Edgar marries Liliane Kaufmann, his first cousin
- 1913 Edgar becomes president of Kaufmanns. 1920 Sales tripled to \$30,000 from 1913
- 1934 Edgar Kauffman Jr. begins apprenticeship with Frank Lloyd Wright. During the depression, Frank Lloyd Wright's creates proposals for WPA sponsored civic projects.
- Fallingwater Commissioned 1935
- 1946 Palm Springs House by Richard Neutra
















